## About King John

Shakespeare's King John depicts the struggle for the crown of England between King John--who holds the crown at the opening of the play--and Arthur, the young son of John's dead older brother Geoffrey. The King of France takes on Arthur's case and France's son Louis the Dauphin soon decides to lay claim for the throne of England.

King John was written as a history play, but after reading it with a modern eye it rather quickly shows signs that it mirrors more our modern soap operas than most high school history classes. Rather than working on King John as a history play, we decided to tackle it like the plot of the daytime soap that it wants to be. Shakespeare's language is rich in melodrama, and the characters are often reminiscent of Susan Lucci and Walt Willey (SIU alum).
